We will:

TO ACHIEVE THIS, YFCU WILL:

Membership Growth:

- Delivering a range of competitions and events to test and build knowledge, attitudes and skills of members.
- Seek opportunities to grow our membership organically
- Build relationships with local schools, creating new opportunities
- Recognise and reward members achievements, e.g. President's Award Scheme

Communication:

- Engage with existing members to encourage active participation
- Improve communications throughout all levels of the organisation
- Embrace technology and media opportunities, e.g. podcasts, vlogs, LinkedIn, etc
- Develop sectoral relationships to ensure rural youth voices are heard
- Promote our positive relationships with partners, sponsors and government departments
- Proactively highlight and speak out on rural and agri-food issues

Education and Training:

- Evaluate current opportunities to ensure that they are relevant and appropriate
- Promote and encourage participation in educational opportunities
- Continue to build on accredited training opportunities, e.g. OCN & AQA
- Offer relevant senior agri focused training opportunities
